# **Technical Procedure for Physical Inspection of Audio Evidence**

- **1.0 Purpose** The purpose of this procedure is to identify the evidence received, inspect it for any damage, and protect the evidence from inadvertent alteration or erasure.
- **2.0 Scope -** This procedure describes the steps to be taken by personnel of the State Crime Laboratory in performing a physical inspection of evidence media received for audio analysis.

### 3.0 Definitions

• Write Protection – A feature available on many types of media which helps to protect the media from inadvertent alteration or deletion. This is sometimes referred to as "Record Protection."

## 4.0 Equipment, Materials and Reagents

Permanent marker

#### 5.0 Procedure

- **5.1** Label the evidence using permanent marker in accordance with the Laboratory Procedure for Evidence Management.
- **5.2** Inspect the evidence for physical damage. If damage is found, refer to the Repair of Video Evidence Procedure for further information prior to the continuation of analysis.
- **5.3** Information specific to the evidence (such as type/size of media, manufacturer, labels, and status of any write protection feature) shall be documented.
- **5.4** If a write protection feature is available, and it was not enabled prior to submission, it shall be enabled prior to analysis.
- 5.5 Identifying markings shall be placed on the evidence if possible. Avoid placing identifying markings on removable labels present on the evidence.
- **5.6** If no native write protection feature exists, a read-only playback device may be used, if available.
